

EVMTAA (E): Hi, Sylvia. Could you tell us about your job?

Sylvia (S): I work in Hong Kong Airport Services Ltd., which provides ramp and cargo services to airlines, airside passenger and crew transportation, and passenger handling services at the Hong Kong International Airport. I am in the Business Support team and I spend half the time working on sustainable development issues and another half on operation support, e.g. planning for large scale activities for the company.

E: How are you involved in the sustainable development of the company?

S: I assist in writing the annual sustainability report, organizing activities to raise colleagues' environmental awareness and preparing training materials.

E: Have you encountered any challenges when implementing sustainable development activities?

S: Yes. First, "sustainable development" is a new concept to a lot of colleagues so my team has to be patient when explaining related ideas to them. Second, the offices are located in different buildings and even districts so it is difficult to arrange meetings and trainings among various departments. Third, as the offices are scattered, it is hard to inspect frequently whether different departments follow the environmental practices of the company.

E: As your company is a member of the Swire Group, does your company exchange information with other companies in the group on sustainable development?

S: Yes. Colleagues who are responsible for sustainable development issues in the member companies of Swire Group meet regularly to exchange information on best practices and share experiences.

E: Could you say a few words to EVMT students and fresh graduates?

S: If you are not sure about your career path, choose a course or job that gives you wide exposure so that you can learn about different ideas and try working in different job functions. In this way, you will have a better idea on your preferences.
